iMovie:

Why:

- 1. Students' creativity is encouraged
- 2. Students show you what they know
- 3. There are many ways to approach the use of iMovie: It's not just "digital story-telling."
- 4. Students can work in teams for collaboration
- 5. Common Core: Google "common core and iMovie" for lists of plans
- 6. Students are empowered, especially in a one to one environment
- 7. Students learn planning strategies using a storyboard

What:

- I. PaperCut animation
 - a Students use their own drawings and cut outs
 - b. Students use stop animation or the Ken Burns effect for motion
- 2. iPad as a camera:
 - a Students film one another
 - b. take photos of themselves in character
 - c. transfer the photos from the iPad to their Airs for use in imivi
- 3. Planning and organizing:
 - a. Use of storyboard template
 - b. Learn how to cycle through the storyboard as they revise based on what is working and what isn't
 - c. develop their "script" for recording their voices
 - d. create the "text" that overlays their project
- 4. Filming Techniques:
 - a students learn basic film technique and shots
 - b. students practice POV with the camera
 - c. students learn how to break up their project into manageable pieces
 - d. students gain an understanding of the power of media

- 2. Use iPhoto as source for their stills
- 3. Use Garageband: send to iTunes for inclusion
- 4. download photos from the Internet: crediting source
- 5. assembling the project
- 6. adding the voice over, sound track, transitions, titles (text), Ken Burns effect on stills
- 7. exporting the movie to share with others
